#### EEN Member Helps Haiti Rebuild by Kalin Thomas

As I watched in horror as Haiti crumbled under the earthquake in January, I thought what can I do to help? Many people in Atlanta and all over the country donated clothing, food, water and other supplies; but there were some people who actually went to Haiti to help. One of those people is our own East End Neighbors (EEN) member, Joanna Pritchard. Joanna is a community health advocate and helped form the Glenwood Pedestrian Safety Initiative - now a committee of EEN. She was in Port-au-Prince from March 2 to May 8 working with the International Organization for Migration (IOM). Since she was not back in Atlanta before this newsletter was published, I decided to pull from an email she sent to me.

Joanna worked in Haiti in the 1990's, and after the January 2010 earthquake she called a friend there to see if she could help. IOM has worked in sustainable community development in Haiti for years, and now also has a leadership role in refugee resettlement. Much of the work is funded by USAID dollars. IOM needed additional staff in the Port-au-Prince office to support their expanded activities and to let exhausted staff members take some leave time. "It's an honor to be back here and be part of this work in Haiti," said Joanna. She added, "I love Haiti and it will be

"I stay inside my office night and day to help get as many projects underway as possible in my short time here. And it protects me against the dreadful reality of the situation. If I open myself to the destruction it gets into my body and fills me with a despair that dissolves my concentration. So much that was good, [has been] destroyed: lives, homes, families, hospitals, churches, schools, records, government offices. Those 50 lines on my project sheet that say "rubble removal" all represent schools that collapsed. I stare at the list. The words are bitter. This city, this country did not have spare resources to lose...But between flashbacks, grief, and moments of melancholy, Haitian people are determined to get on with rebuilding, to cling to the progress, which has unfathomably become more of a lifeline than before."

#### Community Leader N. H. Scott



Mr. Nathaniel Herbert Scott, III, a leader in the East End area for many years, passed on in February. We remember his many years of service to the community, especially in helping to improve the park on Tilson Road that was named for him in 2003. He was a member of the Mark Trail Community Leisure Citizens Advisory Board from 1975 through 1997, serv-

ing as chairperson 1976-1986 and 1993-1997. He was actively involved in the support and advocacy of a new swimming pool, a new classroom for the recreation center, and many other park improvements. Mr. Scott joined New St. John Baptist Church when he moved to Decatur, and later became a member of Jackson Memorial Baptist Church. His niece, Ms. Estella Scroggins, lives in Martin Heights (also known as Delphine-Barberrie).

Mr. John Whitaker, President of East End Neighbors, was a good

friend of Mr. Scott, as they worked together for the good of the community over the years: "He was very involved, an asset to the community. We are much better off for him. He was a good liaison with county officials. He got roads paved. He was a very hard working family man, politically involved. He looked out for our community. He made sure that our commissioners & the CEO were accountable."

Another East End Board member, Mrs. Pat Green, said "He was a fine neighbor. He was a strong advocate for children & for the community. On any issue that came up, he was involved in it. He worked closely with Commissioner Jacquelyn Scott. He was always busy for others. He would come to your door and ask for people to come out to the Commission meeting. He loved this community. Even at the nursing home in his last years, he took on the role of greeter until the day he died. He was a respected mentor to many."
